
Hasselt: perfect place to unwind

Hasselt is the capital and largest city of the province of Limburg in the Flemish Region of Belgium. Split by the **Demer** River, Hasselt is the ideal place to immerse yourself in **jenever** culture or get away from other big cities. It's known for its **friendly** inhabitants and their dialect, which often sounds more like singing than talking.

Limburgers are generally known for being hospitable and friendly, and Hasselt strongly promotes that image. People often say that you are more likely to receive a warm welcome in Hasselt than in larger, more anonymous cities. Here, **coziness** is more important than anything else!

Since the 16th century, jenever has been distilled in and around Hasselt, initially on a small scale and later Hasselt experienced a boom with dozens of distilleries. **Jenever** was not just a drink, but part of everyday life and the local economy. The annual **Jenever Festivals** (October) reinforce this image. During these festivals, jenever is not only drunk, but also used in delicacies, cocktails, and even art projects.

Hasselt is not a megacity like Antwerp or Brussels. The city center is compact and cozy, giving people the feeling that "everyone knows everyone." This creates a **village-like**, yet urban atmosphere.




